

## **25<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME -- SEPTEMBER 24, 2017**

Today's uncomfortable parable of the workers in the vineyard gives us plenty to think about. We might wonder why someone who works for merely an hour gets paid the same as the person who has worked all day. When set in the context of Jesus' time it is perhaps easier to find the message it brings. The workers were labourers who waited anxiously in the marketplace to be hired. Those who were chosen first were the obvious best choices. Those who were left behind were the disappointed ones. It is not hard to imagine their feelings when we consider the pain of all who are unemployed in our own province. But then, just imagine the joy of those disappointed workers when they were not only surprised by being chosen after all hope was lost, but were generously paid as well. Consider how the early workers had already received the reward of being productive by being chosen early. The parable was not lost on the early listeners of Jesus. Those who had kept the religious laws and observances all their lives were angry at the notion that latecomers would also inherit the kingdom. But they and we need to understand that God does not work on the merit system. God's generosity extends to all of us who very often are eleventh hour workers. We are promised that 'we will rise again' - that this is a free gift of our generous God. The amazing thing about our God is that it is not our length of service that counts but the love with which we serve the God whom we find in our brothers and sisters.

### **Catechetical Formation for Confirmation and Holy Communion**

The catechetical office at the Basilica provides parents with the resources to form their children in faith and prepare them to celebrate the sacraments. This process has the two foci, namely, the home and the parish. This year we will provide some materials for families to use at home. We will invite families to participate fully in the various liturgical ministries at the Sunday liturgy, namely, present the gifts of bread and wine, prepare the altar, carry cross and candles and proclaim the readings. The catechetical formation at the Basilica will also emphasize the liturgical year, especially the seasons of Advent, Christmas-Epiphany as well as Lent-Easter-Pentecost because they are extremely important for faith formation. This year we will celebrate a rite of welcome for children and families who are preparing to celebrate the sacraments of Confirmation and First Eucharist. Part of this celebration will be to present the child with a copy of the lectionary because the Word of God is very important in the faith formation of every Christian.
