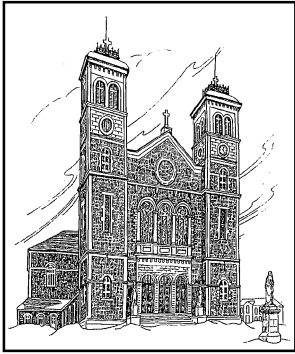

## FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT - SUNDAY, DECEMBER 3, 2017

Today we celebrate the First Sunday in Advent . the season of Advent is about waiting in prayerful hope for the return of the Lord and the return of the Kingdom in all of its richness, fullness, peace, and beauty. Advent is also about trust - trust that the wrongs of this world will be righted, that evil will perish and justice will prevail. The scripture readings for Advent gather our preoccupied thoughts, and focus them once again on the coming into time and space and human flesh of Jesus, not merely as a past event but also as a present experience and future joy yet to be fully realized. He who was borne of Mary, who lived and died and rose again to reveal the ways and will of God to humanity, remains present in the Sacred Word; in the Living Bread; in the sacramental moments which mark the passage of our lives; in the midst of the community gathered in his name; and in the abiding power of the Holy Spirit.

We encourage expectant parents to register early in their pregnancy. This will allow you to celebrate the Sacrament of Baptism shortly after the baby's birth. **The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated ONCE A MONTH ... except during Lent and Advent.**

**THE GOSPEL OF MARK YEAR B ...** In our new Liturgical Year B, beginning today on the First Sunday of Advent, we listen to the Gospel of Mark in our weekend Liturgies. Last year we heard from the Gospel of St. Matthew in Year A, and in the next Liturgical year, we will hear from St. Luke in Cycle C. Most scholars say Mark was the first Gospel written perhaps between 65-70AD (ACE) after many Christians were killed in Rome under the persecution of Emperor Nero. Sts. Peter and Paul were among these martyrs. Maybe that was the reason why Mark found it important to write a written record of Jesus - who he was, what he did and what he taught. The writer John **Mark**, mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles as a companion of Barnabas and Paul on their missionary journey, was not one of the original apostles. It has been tradition to say that Mark went to Rome with St. Peter and he heard all about Jesus from Peter. Mark is believed to have written the Gospel in Rome and so his audience would be Roman Christians and Gentiles. So Mark's Gospel would tell us what Peter said about Jesus Christ, Son of God. Mark's Gospel is fast paced. There is no mention of Jesus' birth or childhood and begins with John the Baptist and Jesus's Baptism and Jesus' 40 days desert experience of temptation. Mark's Gospel is a simple and yet vivid account of Jesus' ministry, emphasizing more what Jesus did than what he said. Mark's Jesus is the most human Jesus. He is easy to relate to, shows his feelings, is very approachable, and is always surrounded by crowds. One of the main themes of Mark's Gospel is the messianic secret. Jesus does not admit to or reveal his messiahship in the first half of the Gospel but acknowledges it after Peter's confession. It reaches its pinnacle when the Centurion at the cross says: "Truly, this was the Son of God." Mark also focuses on the Kingdom of God and discipleship.

## ***RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS ...***

The Christian community has a role in Christian Initiation of Adults. The Christian community supports the candidates by love, prayer, and witness and by testifying that they are ready to complete their initiation. Candidates are also assisted by sponsors who walk with them in faith and present them to the community during the liturgical rites.
