Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left.

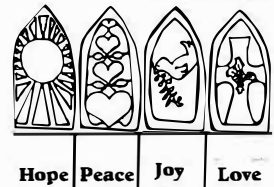
Two women will be grinding meal together;

REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

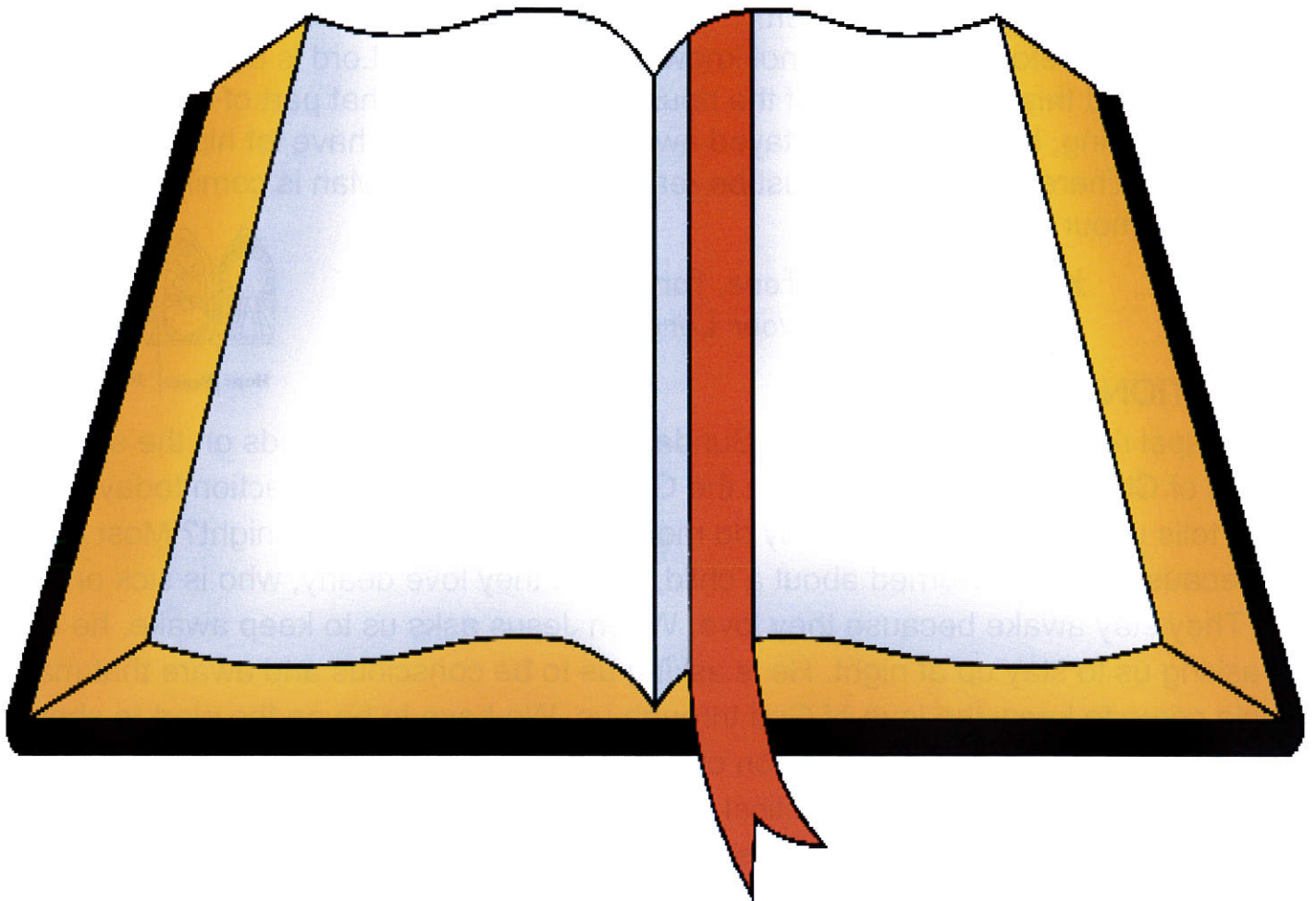
The Gospel readings for the last few Sundays have focused our minds on the second coming of Christ at the end of time. In the Gospel offered for our reflection today, Jesus tells us to “Keep awake.” Why do most parents stay awake at night? Most often it is because they are worried about a child, whom they love dearly, who is sick or out late. They stay awake because they love. When Jesus asks us to keep awake, he is not asking us to stay up at night. He is asking us to be conscious and aware that many people come to know the love of God through us. We have to be on the alert to show people the great love and compassion of God. We have to be always looking for people who are in need of our practical love. Jesus stands before you today, cleverly disguised as a neighbour, a friend or someone who needs your assistance. Stay awake, and do not let Him pass you by!

WRITING YOUR OWN BIBLE A FAMILY ACTIVITY

There are four Gospels—Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Each Gospel was written by a different person, at a different time, for a different audience. Therefore, although there are some common elements, there are also some very different features. For example, all the Gospel writers tell the story of Jesus' crucifixion, death and resurrection. Other than these very important parts, the only other stories shared by all four Gospel writers are John the Baptist and his preaching, the baptism of Jesus, Jesus' rejection at Nazareth, and the feeding of the five thousand. However, only the Gospel of Luke tells the familiar story of the Annunciation, how Mary learned from the Angel Gabriel that she had been chosen to be the mother of God. Did you know that, in Matthew's Gospel, the angel appears to Joseph in a dream, and reveals to him that Mary is to be the mother of God?

For this activity, you are not to use a Bible. Pretend that all the Bibles on earth have been destroyed, and you have been asked to re-construct the Bible, using only your memory! What stories do you remember? (hint—you can use key words to identify the story you want to include!)



THE CHURCH TEACHES

The New Testament: From the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*



125. The Gospels are the heart of all the Scriptures "because they are our principal source for the life and teaching of the Incarnate Word, our Saviour".

126 We can distinguish three stages in the formation of the Gospels:

1. **THE LIFE AND TEACHING OF JESUS** . The Church holds firmly that the four Gospels, "whose historicity she unhesitatingly affirms, faithfully hand on what Jesus, the Son of God, while he lived among men, really did and taught for their eternal salvation, until the day when he was taken up."
2. **THE ORAL TRADITION**. "For, after the ascension of the Lord, the apostles handed on to their hearers what he had said and done, but with that fuller understanding which they, instructed by the glorious events of Christ and enlightened by the Spirit of truth, now enjoyed."
3. **THE WRITTEN GOSPELS**. "The sacred authors, in writing the four Gospels, selected certain of the many elements which had been handed on, either orally or already in written form; others they synthesized or explained with an eye to the situation of the churches, the while sustaining the form of preaching, but always in such a fashion that they have told us the honest truth about Jesus."
