



THE STORY CONTINUES WASHING FEET TODAY

Pope Francis has used every possible opportunity to call our attention to people torn from their homes because of war, violence or persecution. Where do these people come from today? They came from Mali, Eritrea, Syria and Pakistan. They are most often Muslim, Hindu, Catholic and Coptic Christians. On Holy Thursday, last year, Pope Francis knelt down before these displaced people and washed their feet.

The ritual was performed in a center for asylum seekers outside of Rome.

In his homily, Pope Francis said, "All of us together, Muslims, Hindus, Catholics, Copts, Evangelical [Protestants] brothers and sisters — children of the same God — we want to live in peace..."

- Whose feet should you wash this year?
- Who needs to know and feel your love and acceptance?
- Who longs for the Good News to be shown as well as proclaimed by words?

Why is it called a "Triduum" (three days) when we celebrate it on four days (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday)?

The Church counts days from sundown to sundown. So from sundown on Holy Thursday to sundown on Good Friday is the first day. From sundown on Good Friday to sundown on Holy Saturday is the second day. From sundown on Holy Saturday to sundown on Easter Sunday is the third day! There are two celebrations on the first day—the Mass of the Lord's Supper and the Veneration of the Cross. There are no celebrations at all from sundown on Good Friday until sundown on Holy Saturday. That's because this is the time when we remember the time that Jesus was in the tomb. And there are two celebrations on the third day—the Easter Vigil and the Mass of Easter Sunday.

THE GOSPEL FOR TODAY

Matthew 21: 1-11

When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, "The Lord needs them." And he will send them immediately.' This took place to fulfil what had been spoken through the prophet, saying,

'Tell the daughter of Zion,
Look, your king is coming to you,

humble, and mounted on a donkey,
and on a colt, the foal of a donkey.'

The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting, 'Hosanna to the Son of David!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!
Hosanna in the highest heaven!

When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, 'Who is this?' The crowds were saying, 'This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee.'


REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL
